Below you will find important information regarding the BYOD specifications:

- The Department of Education wireless network installed in all NSW Public Schools only operates on the 802.11n 5GHz standard.
- Devices with 802.11a/b/g or 802.11n 2.4GHz only will not be able to connect.
- The battery life of the device should be capable of lasting 5 hours minimum of constant use without charge
- Device hardware specifications must meet the minimum – 64 bit with at least 4GB RAM, however, 8GB RAM is preferred
- Hard Disk Drive space with a minimum of 128GB.
- Currently supported Operating System – PC Windows 10 or above; MacOS 10.6 or above; Chromebook
- Look for Intel Core i3, Core i5 and Core i7 in Windows machines.
